Dear Students,

We here at your local science museum are excited to enlist your help on a new exhibit for our museum. As you know, the issue of rising global temperatures is a pressing one for society today. To address it, the museum would like you to develop an exhibit to help educate our visitors on the topic of climate and its changes over time. Your exhibit can be something that we display online or that we include as part of our permanent displays here at the museum.
